



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Year 3 have learnt so much this week about keeping safe online. Following on from our visit from PC Stu last week, we went on to sensibly explore more about keeping ourselves safe when using the internet. We created a poster to remind people about internet safety and also filled in a table of advantages and disadvantages of digital media and devices. One of the disadvantages included cyber bullying. We suggested strategies for dealing with this, including following the same rules when communicating face to face and online.





We acknowledged age restrictions and suitability of digital devices. We were given a range of familiar apps and games including Roblox, Minecraft, Fortnite, Snapchat and Facebook. We worked in pairs to guess the appropriate age and were shocked to find out some of the age restrictions!

We also learnt that providing information online leaves a digital footprint.

"We did a game when we had to guess what age you need to be to go on Snapchat, Instagram, TikTok and Roblox. For Snapchat, you need to be 13+ and Instagram as well!" ~ **Nicole**


