Year 3 especially enjoyed their First Aid session with Sophie from St John's Ambulance on Wednesday. We started off by recapping DRSABC (Danger, Response, Shout for help, Airway, Breathing, Circulation) and then recapped the recovery position.

We went on to learn the difference between a heart attack and a cardiac arrest (When you stop breathing) Then we practised CPR using the Annie dummies. The children were so sensible that Sophie let us use the pretend defibrillators. We learnt how to do CPR with a defibrillator machine. Working in groups, we all tried very hard and asked super sensible questions such as:

"Would the defibrillator actually shock them if it was real?" -

Oscar

"Does the real defibrillator hurt?" - **Thabile**

We also now know that there are two phone numbers that you can use in an emergency if you are in this country. They are 999 and 112. We remembered the list of six emergency services that you can ask for in an emergency: Police, ambulance, fire service, mountain rescue, coastguard and cave rescue.

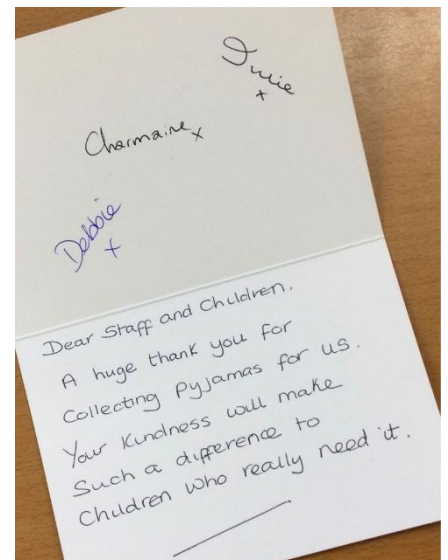

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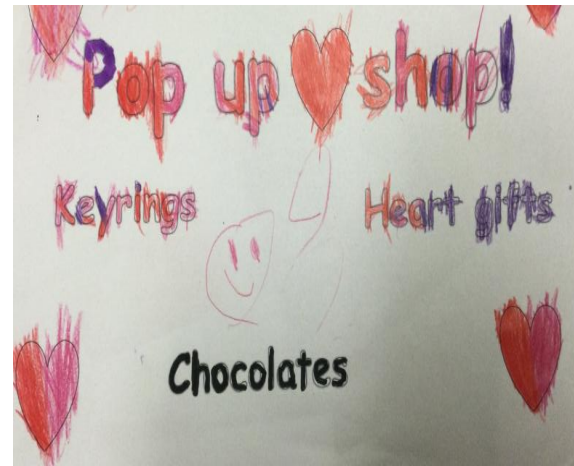
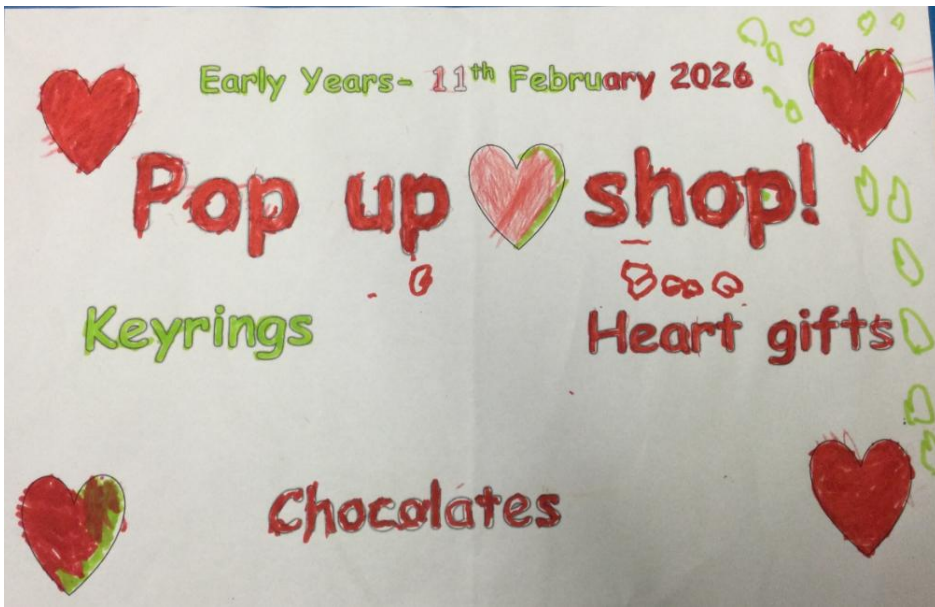
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Early Years have been busy planning and organising a class fundraising activity.
