Year 3 have engaged very well this week during online safety lessons. We started the week with a question of, 'Draw and label when you use the internet' Lots of ideas were given including Minecraft (**Muizz**), Hit the button (**Emily**) and Roblox (**Ava**). We use the internet a lot and realised that we can often depend on it.

We went on to learn how to stay safe online through interesting videos and information. Children went on to create a colourful, informative poster of how to stay safe online and what to do if you feel uncomfortable with something that you read or see when you are online.

The highlight seemed to be an, 'Age Restrictions Quiz' that we played! Children were shown familiar apps/games on the board and had to write down the age that they thought you had to be to use the apps/play the games. Some children were shocked at the answers!

Isla thought that you had to be 18+ to play Roblox but the age restriction is actually 7+ years old. **Thabile** thought you had to be 16 to use, 'Snapchat' but the age restriction is 13+ and **Isaac** though the age restriction on Mario Kart was 8+ but it is actually 3+.

Making children aware of age restrictions for different apps, social media and games is very important.

Children went on to create a table of advantages and disadvantages of using the internet.

Our non-uniform day to raise money for Rupert's Rainbow will be on **Friday 27th March**

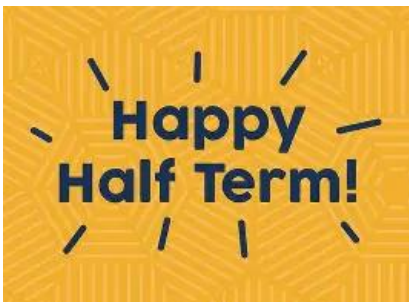
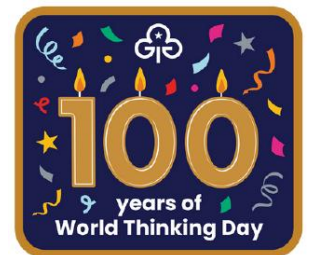
