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On Wednesday, Christine from St John's Ambulance came into school to deliver a First Aid session to **Year 3** and **Year 6**. During the Year 3 session, we recapped DRSABC and basic First Aid, including the recovery position, CPR and choking. We then went on to the focus of this session: Outdoor First Aid!

We discussed when we would need to use a bandage such as if you broke or fractured a bone. Christine demonstrated how to put a bandage on correctly, using Oscars arm. He was very good at pretending that he had hurt himself! 😊

We then had a go at putting a bandage on our friend's arm. It was super tricky but we did really well!

We then spoke about pulls and strains and how the word '**RICE**' can help us to remember what to do if we have strained or pulled

a muscle.

R = Rest it. **I** = Ice pack. **C** = Comfortable bandage. **E** = Elevation.

We spoke about keeping ourselves safe in different weathers and what to do if we get too hot or too cold. We also learnt about head injuries.

To end the session, we learnt about bites and stings and had a look at an epi-pen. We asked super sensible questions including:

Isaac - "How many times can you use the epi-pen?"

Leon and **Teddy** remembered a special rhyme when using an epi-pen: Blue to the sky & orange to the thigh! Da iawn!
